Current challenges

1. Accessibility: A number of governorates are not accessible due to active hostilities or the presence of proscribed armed groups. In other governorates where the humanitarian community has limited access such as Taizz, different impediments are faced, including delays in the issuance of permits, impounding of trucks at checkpoints etc.

2. Security: Worsening security situations and logistical complexities are hampering the delivery of aid to the most vulnerable. Humanitarian aid convoys and personnel continue to be exposed to security risks in certain locations around the country. Despite adopting various mitigating measures, there is an increase in incidents such as theft of relief items on the way to distribution sites and in warehouses by armed groups or other elements.


3. Worsening humanitarian conditions: Increasing needs among local communities and displaced populations alike are resulting in difficulties in the prioritizing and targeting of humanitarian assistance. Deteriorating socio-economic conditions and prolonged conflict are leaving host communities also increasingly in need of basic assistance.
