

WFP Yemen Update on Food and Fuel GOALS Stocks and Shipments (commercial and humanitarian)

08 May 2018

Vessels Discharged at Hodeidah/ Saleef ports

Since the end of the temporary blockade on 22 November 2017, a total of **116 vessels** and **15 dhows** are / have discharged cargo at Hodeidah and Saleef ports.¹

- **10 humanitarian** vessels carrying 231,330 metric tons (mt) of food items, 1 carrying 4 USAID funded mobile cranes and 4 carrying cargo for the Logistics Cluster.
- **16 dhows** carrying 2,321 mt of humanitarian cargo.
- 51 commercial food vessels carrying 1,284,009 mt of wheat (flour, bagged or bulk), sugar, corn, soybean meal and rice have been offloaded at Hodeidah and/or Saleef ports.
- 54 commercial fuel vessels carrying 564,913 mt of diesel, petrol and 1 commercial vessel carrying 44,869 mt of coal have discharged at Hodeidah port.

Vessels Currently Discharging at Hodeidah/ Saleef ports

- **2** commercial food vessels carrying 18,637 mt of rice and bran/wheat flour.
- **4** commercial fuel vessels carrying 37,916 mt of petrol and diesel.
- **3** humanitarian vessels carrying 266 mt of humanitarian cargo, break bulk and medicine.

Vessels Awaiting to Berth at Hodeidah/ Saleef ports

There are currently **17** commercial fuel vessels at inner anchorage waiting to berth and discharge at Hodeidah port.

• **17** commercial fuel vessels carrying 205,172 mt of petrol or diesel.

Vessels Waiting Coalition Clearance at Hodeidah/Saleef ports

• **2** commercial food vessels carrying 24,503 mt of rice, wheat flour and sugar in bags.

Container Vessels

• **1** containerized vessel carrying approximately 11,700 mt of WFP humanitarian food commodities in **691 shipping containers** is expected to arrive to Hodeidah Port on 20 May, conditional to UNVIM Clearance and coalition permission. This is the first containerized vessel to call to the port since the end of the temporary blockade on 22 November 2017.

Commercial Food Commodities Available

As of 15 April 2018:

- **584,465** mt of cereals on the market sufficient for 70 days².
- **67,100** mt of rice sufficient for 57 days.
- **100,000** mt of sugar.
- Less than **100,000** mt of vegetable oil, salt, dry pulses and corn.

Commercial Fuel Commodities Available

As of 15 April 2018:

- **74** million mt of diesel.
- **53** million mt of petrol.

WFP Humanitarian Food Availability

As of 05 May:

• **135,000** mt of wheat.

WFP Food Commodities Expected – May 2018 As of 05 May:

• **67,000** mt of wheat.
