

Our Engagement in Yemen's Active Conflict. The World Bank's current emergency program

provides critical support to Yemeni families and communities across the country. It helps the people cope with the impact of the crisis through income support, cash transfers, health and nutrition interventions, cholera response, and restoration of agriculture production. Emergency grants to Yemen are financed by IDA. Since July 2016, IDA grants have exceeded US\$1.2 billion financing emergency operations for the benefit of the Yemeni people.

Current IDA Emergency Portfolio Through the UN Comprises 5 Active Operations Totaling \$1.22 Billion (\$910 Million (73.3%) Disbursed).

Leveraging Partnership for Implementation in Conflict. The Bank has forged an extraordinary operational partnership with key UN agencies and local service delivery institutions for the implementation of our program. By leveraging these local and international partnerships, we aim to preserve the implementation capacity of Yemeni institutions now and for the country's future and sustain their ability to deliver basic services that millions of Yemenis rely on.

Operations Portfolio

- 1 Emergency and Crisis Response Project IDA. This includes: i) Labor Intensive Works and Economic Livelihood in partnership with UNDP and ii) Emergency Cash Transfers in partnership with UNICEF.
- **2 Emergency Health and Nutrition** in partnership with UNICEF and WHO– IDA. This also includes an Emergency Cholera Response component in partnership with UNICEF and WHO.
- 3 Smallholder Agricultural Production Restoration and Enhancement GAFSP in partnership with FAO.
- 4 Integrated Urban Service Delivery IDA in partnership with UNOPS.
- 5 Emergency Electricity Access Project IDA in partnership with UNOPS.

Key Development Results

- ▶ 1.45mn households (more than 9mn individuals) received 3 quarters of cash transfers country-wide.
- ▶ 6mn work days created directly benefiting 308,000 (and about 1.8mn indirect beneficiaries).
- ▶ 190,000 at risk mothers and children received nutrition-sensitive cash transfers and referral services.
- ▶ 14.6mn people receiving essential health and nutrition services nation-wide.
- **6mn** beneficiaries were reached through water disinfection and hygiene.
- ▶ 1.43mn people provided with access to improved water sources in cholera affected areas.
- ▶ 1.79mn people provided with access to improved sanitation in cholera affected areas
- ▶ 5.3mn children have been vaccinated against preventable diseases including polio.
- ▶ 640,665 people received treatment for cholera and the case fatality rate went down from 2.3% to 0.21%. Furthermore, 2,920 health facilities received support from the project for operating costs.
- ▶ 4,500 health personnel provided with per diems and transportation allowance.
- **9** microfinance institutions assisted/revived (85,000 micro finance client beneficiaries) and over 2,550 distressed micro enterprises revived.
- ▶ 47,300 farmers received emergency start-up packages to resume agricultural production.
- ▶ 17,800 households (about125,000 individuals) benefited from rehabilitation of community water infrastructure.
- First 180 KW solar system installed in hospital visited by 4,000 patients daily.
